

MBBS Program Outcomes

The MBBS program outcomes aligned with vision and mission of KMU, NWSM and with the identified Pakistan Medical Commission generic professional competencies for medical graduates to provide optimal health care, leading to better health outcomes for patients and societies. These competencies are divided into seven roles including Knowledgeable and Skillful Physician, Community Health Promoter (Health Advocate), Problem-solver (Collaborator), Communicator, Professional, Scholar, Leader and Role Model.
